CHECK ALL PARTS

- · Be certain there are no missing parts.
- · Be certain all required tools are available.

REQUIRED TOOLS

- · Ratchet or Breaker Bar.
- · Socket 1/2-inch AND Wrench 1/2-inch
- Towels (or something soft) to rest components on during assembly to protect the finish

ASSISTANCE REQUIRED

- · 3+ people recommended to assemble product.
- Necessary to handle, fit, and secure components.
- Heavy lifting.

All specifications are subject to change. Contact manufacturer for details. Directions do not include center armrest attachment.

DELIVERY, STORAGE, and HANDLING

- A. Delivery: Deliver products to site in manufacturer's original, unopened containers and packaging. Upon delivery, examine packages immediately to ensure all products are complete and undamaged.
- B. Storage: Store products in a protected, dry area in manufacturer's unopened containers and packaging
- C. Handling: Protect product's finish from damage during handling and installation.

INSTALLATION

- A. Clearance for 3/8-inch (9.53mm) anchor bolts (anchor bolts not provided by Victor Stanley, Inc.)
- B. Mounting: It is not recommended to locate anchor bolts until bench is in place. This Victor Stanley, Inc. product must be permanently affixed to the ground. Consult your local codes for regulations.


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
ATTENTION: ALL IMAGES ARE OF NRMT'S CONFIGURED FOR NRMS SEATS THE STEPS REMAIN THE SAME FOR FRMS SEATS

Remove all parts from their boxes and bags, and place on towels or a soft surface to prevent scratching (towels, cardboard, grass, ect.)

STEP #2 For surface mount, set the legs up right in the general area that you would like your NRMT. For in-ground mount place the channel on a soft surface with the leg mounting plates facing upwards. Have this about the length of the leg away from the area that you would like your NRMT.




For surface mount, set the channel on the legs. Attach one leg. Have one person lift the channel slightly on the side that the leg is not yet attached, and have another person possition the second leg for mounting (if more legs are specified, continue this process one leg at a time). For in-ground mount, attach all the legs so they are pointing straight up in the áir.



For step #3 use Bolt Assembly as shown:

HAND TIGHTEN




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
STEP #4

For in-ground mount, have two people lift the channel with the attached legs. Have a third person aid in turning the assembly so the legs are now parallel to the ground. Set the assembly back down, make sure the channel is set back on the soft surface to pertect the finish. Use the legs as a guide for where to place your footings.



STEP #5

Check and review location and positioning. Make any adjustments to placement/loacation now. For surface mount, Remove assembly and place anchor bolts in position. For in-ground mount, Remove assembly and prepare footings in possition. At this point mount your assembly in/to the ground. This Victor Stanley, Inc. product must be permanently affixed to the ground. Consult your local codes for regulations.



STEP #6

Have two people lift each seat one at a time. Have another person assist with aligning the holes on the seat braces with those of the channel. Fasten the seat. Repeat for all seats.







HAND TIGHTEN


Carefully inspect the assembly from front and back to ensure the seats of the assmebly are sitting straight.

Once everything is straight and aligned properly, tighten the Bolts connecting the legs to the channel and the channel to the seats. While tightening have someone make sure that the assembly remains straight and aligned.




TOOL TIGHTEN
